

Finding Articles in PubMed

- PubMed extensively covers biomedical literature - to access PubMed go to <http://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/> - then click on “PubMed” on the top right.
- Type in your topic of interest and search.
- Many of the records in PubMed will contain links to full-text versions of the articles – to get full text, try the following:
 - 1) Click on the article’s title to see the full citation – once you have done that check the upper right hand corner for a publisher’s icon with the words “full text”, click on that icon to see if the publisher is providing full text access (note: even if a publisher’s icon exists, UMCP may not have access to the content
 - 2) When you are looking at the full citation click the yellow “find it” button beneath the article citation and this will search the UMD library system to see if we have purchased access to an electronic or paper copy of the article (click on the “Go” button next to the publishers listed under “Is it Online?” to get electronic access, or click on the “Go” button under “Is it in the Library?” to check our print holdings.
 - 3) If you still can’t find a copy of your article (print or electronic), you may submit an interlibrary loan request – to do this go to the following website: <http://www.lib.umd.edu/ILL/Welcome.html> and follow the instructions (note: before submitting an interlibrary loan request please make sure that UMCP does not have electronic or print access – your request will be rejected if access is available at UMCP).
- In addition, it is possible to set up a personalized search alert whereby PubMed will regularly send you an email showing new results for your topic of interest.
