

Finding Articles in Web of Science

- Web of Science covers a broad range of scientific disciplines and it will allow for the discovery of how various articles on a given subject are related (i.e. who cited who and who was cited by whom). Web of Science can be accessed through Research Port.
- Type in your topic of interest and search.
- Many of the records in Web of Science will contain links to full-text versions of the articles – to get full text, try the following:
 - 1) Click the yellow “find it” button beneath the article citation and this will search the UMD library system to see if we have purchased access to an electronic or paper copy of the article (click on the “Go” button next to the publishers listed under “Is it Online?” to get electronic access, or click on the “Go” button under “Is it in the Library?” to check our print holdings.
 - 2) If you still can’t find a copy of your article (print or electronic), you may submit an interlibrary loan request – to do this go to the following website: <http://www.lib.umd.edu/ILL/Welcome.html> and follow the instructions (note: before submitting an interlibrary loan request please make sure that UMCP does not have electronic or print access – your request will be rejected if access is available at UMCP).
- In addition, it is possible to set up a personalized search alert whereby Web of Science will regularly send you an email showing new results for your topic of interest.
