Travelling to New York City:

PATH: Use the Pavonia/Newport station located two blocks north of the hotel at the intersection of Washington Boulevard and Pavonia Avenue. Travel on the Hoboken to WTC line. From Pavonia/Newport to WTC station travel time is 7 minutes. The WTC station is located at Vessey Street and West Broadway. One-way fare is \$1.75. For schedules, fares, and maps see: www.panynj.gov/path

Directions: By foot: From the World Trade Center station head north on West Broadway for 9 blocks, then make a slight left onto Varick Street. Continue on Varick Street for about 5 blocks. After crossing Canal Street 75 Varick Street will be the first building on the left. It is designated as One Hudson Square. The American Numismatic Society is on the 11th Floor. Travel time is approximately 15 minutes.

Directions: By subway (www.mta.info): From the World Trade Center station transfer to the New York City subway E train uptown. Walk two blocks north on Church Street to Barclay Street. One-way fare is \$2.25. Exit at the Canal Street station. Travel time is 2 minutes. After exiting the station head west along Canal Street two blocks to reach Varick Street. Turn right onto Varick Street. 75 Varick Street will be the first building on the left. It is designated as One Hudson Square. The American Numismatic Society is on the 11th Floor.

Here is your opportunity to go behind the financial news headlines by visiting the Federal Reserve Bank located in the heart of New York City's financial district. The tour will begin with an overview of the Records Management and Archives programs, including stops in the Archives storage space and the records center. Participants will then see the Gold Vault, which rests on the solid bedrock of Manhattan Island, 50 feet below sea level, and holds billions of dollars worth of bars. PATH: Use the Pavonia/Newport station located two blocks north of the hotel at the intersection of Washington Boulevard and Pavonia Avenue. Travel on the Journal Square to 33rd Street line. From Pavonia/Newport to 33rd Street station travel time is 15 minutes. The 33rd Street PATH station is located in midtown Manhattan at Avenue of the Americas (6th Avenue) between 32nd and 33rd Street. One-way fare is \$1.75. Directions: By subway (www.mta.info): From the 33rd Street station transfer to the New York City subway B train. Take the B train uptown. One-way fare is \$2.25. Exit at the 81st Street station. The 33rd Street PATH station is located in midtown Manhattan at Avenue of the Americas (6th Avenue) between 32nd and 33rd Street. One-way fare is \$1.75. Directions: By subway (www.mta.info): From the 33rd Street station transfer to the New York City subway number 1 train. Walk north to 34th Street and walk west for one block to the subway station 34th Street and Penn Station. Take the number 1 train uptown. One-way fare is \$2.25. Exit at the 66th Street and Lincoln Center station. Travel time is 6 minutes. After exiting the station head west to the corner of 65th Street and Amsterdam Avenue. Walk south on Amsterdam Avenue. The library entrance is located between 65th and 64th Streets.

T7. NYU and Washington Square

The tour will begin in the lobby of the Elmer Holmes Bobst Library, the Philip Johnson designed structure that serves as the home to three of the University's special collections repositories: the New York University Archives, Fales Library & Special Collections, and the Tamiment Library and Wagner Labor Archives. We'll learn about the history of the building and its design, and tour the lobby exhibit as well as the Fales exhibit space. Weather permitting, we'll then take a walk around Washington Square Park, which has anchored the University "campus" since its inception in 1831. We'll explore the history of the park—from parade ground to potters' field to protest site—and the buildings facing it. library.nyu.edu

Travelling to New York City:

PATH: Use the Pavonia/Newport station located two blocks north of the hotel at the intersection of Washington Boulevard and Pavonia Avenue. Travel on the Journal Square to 33rd Street line. From Pavonia/Newport to the 9th Street station travel time is 10 minutes. The 9th Street PATH station is located on 6th Avenue (Avenue of the Americas) at West 9th Street. One-way fare is \$1.75. Directions: By foot: From the 9th Street station walk south on 6th Avenue (Avenue of the Americas) for four blocks to West 4th Street. Turn left onto West 4th Street (later Washington Square South). Walk west for four blocks to the corner of Laguardia Place and West 4th Street. Bobst Library is a large red building located at 70 Washington Square South. Travel time is approximately 10 minutes.

T8. Trinity Church and Trinity Church Archives

Tour Trinity Church and Archives, which has stood at the head of Wall Street since 1697 when it was incorporated by William III of England. Trinity Church Archives has records going back to 1695 documenting the history of the Church as well as the development of New York. Records include the 1705 land grant from Queen Anne of England, legal opinions signed by Alexander Hamilton, and deeds signed by Aaron Burr.

Travel time is 7 minutes.
