## **BIOGRAPHY**

David Lee Crippens was born September 23, 1942 in Nashville, Tennessee. He received a BA in Political Science from Antioch University in 1964 and a Masters of Social Work from San Diego State University in 1968.

From 1964 to 1966, Crippens served as a Peace Corps volunteer in Nigeria. After his return, he worked as the associate director of the educational opportunities program at San Diego State University from 1968 to 1969. He continued to work in San Diego as a producer for KPBS-TV, a public television station, from 1969 to 1971. In 1971, he moved to the East Coast to work as a staff producer, writer, and newsperson for the Pittsburgh public television station, WQED-TV. He worked there until 1973.

In 1973, Crippens moved back to the West Coast to work as the director of Educational Services at KCET, Los Angeles' public television station. In 1977 he was promoted to vice president of Educational Services. From 1980 to 1983, Crippens served as a vice president and a stage manager. In 1983, he became the vice president of National Productions for KCET. He held this position until 1985, when he became the senior vice president of Educational Enterprises, a position which he still holds.

In his role as the senior vice president of the Educational Enterprises, Crippens oversees the production and coordination of educational programs and services for KCET. The primary objective of the department is the development, production and acquisition of educational instructional programs. Under Crippens' leadership, Educational Enterprises produced a wide range of programs on topics such as children and computers, earthquakes, math for parents, and health and substance abuse, particularly the dangers of smoking for minority audiences.

Crippens served as the executive-in-charge of outreach activities designed to support and extend the educational applications of broadcast presentations through a wide variety of print materials and community or school-based activities. He was the project Director on a project funded by the National Science Foundation, "Count On Me." The "Count On Me" collaborative efforts offered parent-teacher workshops in mathematics. He also produced and moderated number of teleconferences, some which also dealt with the issue of teacher mathematics.

Crippens is also very involved with the school-to-career field and worked closely with the National Council for Research in Vocational Education (NCRVE) and the Center for Occupational Research and Development (CORD). He was a keynote speaker at several conferences for both organizations and played roles in various School-to-Work and Tech Prep conferences.

Crippens serves on the board of a number of organizations, including Antioch University Advisory Committee, Editorial Project in Education, the Community Coalition for Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment, the National Black Programming Consortium, Inroads, and the Center for Occupational Research and

Development (CORD). Under his direction, the KCET Educational Enterprises Department received an award from the Centers for Disease Control and prevention for its efforts in children's health in 1997 and the 1997 Distinguished Service to Health Education Award from the Association for the Advancement of Health Education (AAHE). Additionally, Crippens has earned many individual awards, including the National Citation Award from the National Sorority of Phi Delta Kappa and the John Swett Award from the California Teachers Association for Outstanding Coverage of Educational Issues and Concerns.

## **SCOPE AND CONTENT**

The David L. Crippens Papers cover the years 1969 to 1998. The bulk of the materials date from 1993 to 1997. The collection documents Crippens' career in public television, particularly focusing on his time at KCET/Los Angeles, the various conferences and meetings he attended, and his speeches. Types of materials include correspondence, travel itineraries, brochures, programs, pamphlets, article clippings, speeches, receipts, photographs, certificates, reports, proposals, overhead transparencies, and a banner.

## **SERIES DESCRIPTIONS**

### Series 1: Conferences, 1993-1998 (3.25 linear feet)

This series documents many of the conferences that Crippens attended between the years of 1993 and 1998 as the senior vice president of Educational Enterprises.

#### *Subseries 1: Conferences Attended by Crippens as a Panel Member or Speaker, 1993-1997 (1.25 linear feet)*

This subseries contains materials from the conferences that Crippens attended as a panel member or a speaker. The substance of the conferences varied from health services to minority opportunities and other educational television topics. Materials include travel itineraries, correspondence, article clippings, programs, speech drafts, pamphlets, and receipts, and are arranged alphabetically by the name of the sponsoring organization, then chronologically.

#### *Subseries 2: Other Conferences Attended by Crippens, 1993-1997 (0.75 linear feet)*

This subseries contains materials from conferences that Crippens attended but did not formally participate in. The conference topics vary from education in the sciences to math education to minority opportunities to businesses. Materials include travel itineraries, correspondence, article clippings, programs, pamphlets, and receipts, and are arranged alphabetically by the name of the sponsoring organization, then chronologically.

#### *Subseries 3: School-to-Work Conferences, 1994-1998 (7 folders)*

This subseries covers various School-to-Work conferences that Crippens either spoke at or simply attended. School-to-Work is a national and local initiative designed to improve education for all students of all ages and all ability levels by providing all students with high academic skills and the necessary workforce skills. Materials include travel itineraries, correspondence, article clippings, programs, pamphlets, and receipts, and are arranged chronologically.

#### *Subseries 4: Tech Prep, 1993-1997 (1.00 linear feet)*

This subseries covers various Tech Prep conferences that Crippens either spoke at or simply attended. Tech Prep is a national and local initiative that provides a continuing educational program of applied and technical courses on the secondary and post secondary levels, and prepares students to effectively work in a changing high tech society. Materials include travel itineraries, correspondence, article clippings, programs, pamphlets, and receipts, and are arranged chronologically.

Series 2: Meetings, 1993-1997 (2.50 linear feet)

This series documents the meetings of various organizations that Crippens attended over the years. He was a member of several advisory councils and boards of directors for organizations that include: the American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS), Antioch University, Center for Occupational Research and Development (CORD), Inroads, National Black Programming Consortium, and UNITE-LA. Materials include travel itineraries, correspondence, article clippings, programs, pamphlets, speech drafts, and receipts, and are arranged alphabetically by the title of the sponsoring organization and then chronologically.

Series 3: Speeches by Crippens, 1993-1997 (1.00 linear feet)

This series covers various speeches and public appearances made by Crippens between the years of 1993 and 1997. The topics of speeches varies from minority opportunities to educational television to vocational training. Additionally, Crippens served as the master of ceremonies for several dinners or functions. Materials include travel itineraries, correspondence, article clippings, programs, pamphlets, and speech drafts, and are arranged alphabetically by the title of the sponsoring organization.

Series 4: Public Television, 1993-1997 (1.25 linear feet)

This series documents various aspects of Crippens' career in public television.

*Subseries 1: Corporation for Public Broadcasting (CPB), 1993-1996 (3 folders)*

This subseries covers some of Crippens' dealings with the Corporation for Public Broadcasting (CPB). Topics include a conference, technology, and the hiring of a new senior vice president of education at CPB. Materials include travel itineraries, correspondence, article clippings, programs, and pamphlets, and are arranged chronologically.

*Subseries 2: KCET/Los Angeles, 1993-1997 (0.50 linear feet)*

This subseries documents Crippens' work at KCET as the Senior Vice President of Educational Enterprises and other departments of the station. Topics include presentations, meetings, staff retreats, and other KCET activities. Materials include travel itineraries, correspondence, programs, pamphlets, notes, and overhead transparencies, and are arranged alphabetically by department, then chronologically.

*Subseries 3: Public Broadcasting Service (PBS), 1993-1997 (0.25 linear feet)*

This subseries covers some of Crippens' dealings with PBS. Topics include conferences, retreats, meetings, satellites, literacy and math programs, and

vocational training. Materials include travel itineraries, correspondence, article clippings, programs, pamphlets, and reports, and are arranged alphabetically by topic.

*Subseries 4: Other Stations and Organizations, 1993-1996 (5 folders)*

This subseries covers Crippens' dealings with public television stations and organizations other than CPB, KCET, and PBS. These stations include KQED, San Francisco, Association of America's Public Television Stations (APTS), and WHRO radio. Materials include travel itineraries, correspondence, article clippings, programs, and pamphlets, and are arranged alphabetically by station or organization.

*Subseries 5: Programs/Proposals, 1994-1997 and undated (0.50 linear feet)*

This subseries covers various proposals and program descriptions that Crippens reviewed, created, or produced. He was especially involved in "Count On Me," a parent-teacher math initiative; the National Science Foundation; and his own idea, "Pigeons Everywhere." Materials include travel itineraries, correspondence, article clippings, programs, and pamphlets, and are arranged alphabetically by program.

Series 5: Personal Papers, 1969-1997 and undated (0.50 linear feet )

*Subseries 1: Photographs, 1969-1990, and undated (0.25 linear feet)*

This subseries contains photographs that document many positions held by Crippens throughout his career in public television with KPBS/San Diego, WQED/Pittsburgh, and KCET/Los Angeles. Topics include shows hosted by Crippens such as *Say Brother*, various conferences, awards ceremonies, lunches with notable people such as Maxine Waters, Edward Kennedy, and Fred (Mr.) Rogers. Materials include photographs and are arranged chronologically and then alphabetically by subject.

*Subseries 2: Writings By and About David L. Crippens, 1969-1988 and undated (8 folders)*

This subseries contains various writings that concern Crippens or were written by Crippens. These writings include a fashion shoot about college administrators which included Crippens, ads for television shows hosted or produced by Crippens, and speeches. Materials are arranged chronologically.

*Subseries 3: Honors and Awards, 1973-1997 and undated (9 folders)*

This subseries deals with honors and awards bestowed upon Crippens for his work in public television. Awarding institutions include National Association

of Educational Broadcasters (NAEB), Phi Delta Kappa Sorority, the American Association for Health Education (AAHE), and National Research Council Mathematical Sciences Education Board. Materials include certificates, travel itineraries, programs, and a banner from the back of his chair as Vice President of Education at KCET, and are arranged chronologically.
